Key Points in History

2008 - 65-bed Level 3 NICU opens at CRMC

2011 - 19 beds added to CRMC's Level 3 NICU; total 84

2015 - UCSF Benioff and CMC enter agreement to increase access to pediatric subspecialists here

2016 - 10-bed PICU opens at CRMC

Community Medical Centers: Fiscal Year 2016 Key Figures

- 10,873 deliveries annually - nearly 65% of all babies in Fresno County
- 71,000 pediatric visits annually
- Nearly 10% of CMC's 679,000 annual patient visits are pediatric (FY15)
- Operating margin: 6%
- Charity Care at cost: 6.07%

Snapshot: Community Regional Medical Center FY16

- Second busiest general hospital in state of California (2015 OSHPD; total discharges)
- About 530 patients each month are transferred from other hospitals to CRMC for higher level care

-Level 3 NICU & High-Risk Deliveries

- 84 Level 3 NICU beds; ADC 55
 - In 2015, 5,365 babies were born, 1,088 were admitted to the NICU and 232 were transferred in from other hospitals
- Second in CA for most deliveries of babies weighing less than 3lbs. 5oz. (OSHPD 2015; First in 2011 & 2012)
- CRMC is only hospital where UCSF NICU residents do rotations; downtown NICU needed for teaching program
- Only local hospital with high-risk pregnancy antepartum unit taking transfers from 3-county region
- Only local hospital with a perinatology and neonatology specialists in-house 24/7
- Home to one of a handful of Newborn & Prenatal Screening labs in CA
- JAMA looked at 37 publications and 22 US studies of more than 105,000 births showing **62% increased risk of dying for extremely premature babies born at hospitals without a Level 3 NICU** compared to those born at a hospital with a Level 3 NICU like Community Regional's
- 2012 Pediatric Journal published study showed **100-300% higher risk-adjusted mortality for low-weight babies born in hospitals without a high level NICU**

- In 1993 the Federal Maternal Child Health Bureau set a goal for 90% of very low birth-weight babies to be born at hospitals with Level 3 NICUs, by 2008 only 5 states had reached that mark

-Pediatric Cases

- 8 Pediatric beds, PICU 10 beds
- 57,100 pediatric encounters <21 years old
- 3,400 pediatric inpatients <21 years old
- 1,100 pediatric surgical cases
- 53,700 pediatric outpatients
- 89% of pediatric cases are Medi-Cal or Managed Medi-Cal

-Pediatric Trauma Cases

- Average 510 pediatric trauma cases per year <21 years old
- 130 pediatric trauma admitted <16 years old in 2014

Snapshot: Clovis Community Medical Center FY16

- 8 Level 2 NICU beds, ADC 5
- 5,508 deliveries
- 539 babies admitted to Clovis' Level 2 NICU
- 9,700 pediatric visits annually through ED
