

Fact Sheet:

Clovis Community Medical Center

Background

Clovis Community Medical Center has grown in scope and reputation since its establishment in 1965 as the 35-bed, acute-care Clovis Memorial Hospital at DeWitt and Sierra avenues in Clovis, California.

In 1979, the hospital merged with the then-Fresno Community Hospital, and in 1982, Clovis Memorial Hospital's name changed to Clovis Community Hospital. Clovis residents, merchants, volunteers and others continued with fundraising efforts and personal contributions for future expansion and equipment needs.

In 1988, Clovis Community Hospital opened at its current location on the northeast corner of Herndon and Temperance avenues. The acclaimed medical center provides care and healing in a serene environment. Now known as Clovis Community Medical Center, the hospital is often Valley residents' first choice for women's and children's services, advanced surgeries and comprehensive care.

The Clovis Outpatient Care Center was built in 2002 and is one of the busiest outpatient surgery centers in the area, performing about 900 surgeries a month in its 10 operating rooms. A dedicated endoscopy suite was completed in a 2009 expansion which included a six-bay pre-operative area, four procedure rooms, private family conference area and private exit with reserved patient pick-up area.

Breast care services also were expanded to allow the Marjorie E. Radin Breast Care Center to continue meeting the unique needs of women while setting a new standard of care for breast health. Here, advanced technology and medical leaders in breast care have come together in a welcoming, comfortable environment. Radin has specialists in imaging, diagnostics, surgery, pathology, medical and radiology oncology, genetics and specially trained oncology emotional support caregivers who meet together to coordinate a custom treatment plan for each patient. A nurse navigator assists in scheduling and managing appointments while coordinating care and educating patients so they can focus on getting better.

The Radin Breast Care Center has been designated as a Center of Excellence by both the American College of Radiology and the National Quality Measures for Breast Centers.

In 2008, to continue to meet the area's growth, Clovis Community embarked on a massive \$300 million expansion and renovation project focused on inpatient expansion.

This expansion and renovation nearly doubled the hospital's capacity to 208 private rooms – making Clovis Community the only comprehensive hospital in the area with all-private rooms.

Clovis Community Expansion Medical Office Buildings

Since May 2013, three medical office buildings have been added to the Clovis campus. With a combined 160,000 square feet, the following physician specialties are offered:

Community Cancer Institute

A 100,000-square-foot cancer center opened Aug. 1, 2018. The vision for the center is to bring comprehensive outpatient services under one roof including imaging, radiation and chemotherapy. A multidisciplinary team of physicians and support staff provides one place for patients to come for their cancer treatment, clinic visits, lab work, medications and support services.

The cancer center has the newest version of CyberKnife®, the latest in digital imaging, CT and MRI scanners and four linear accelerators for radiation treatment. The Community Cancer Institute has one of the first all-digital PET/CT scanners in California – so patients spend far less time in the scanner and doctors are able to detect much smaller cancer cells.

Main Campus Expansion – phased opening 2022
Upon completion, the bed capacity will increase by 144 beds, bringing our total number of private rooms from 208 to 352. This expansion of the CCMC main campus will provide 420 new job opportunities, therapists, technicians and support staff and is expected to employ 2,500 local trade workers while under construction.
