Background

Community Regional Medical Center is the flagship of Community Medical Centers' four inpatient hospitals, with an average daily census of 638 patients. The four facilities under Community Regional's license see a combined total of about 820 inpatients a day.

It began in 1897 with Celia Burnett, proprietor of a successful boarding house at the southeast corner of Fulton and Calaveras streets in Fresno, CA. She joined forces with physicians to form a private hospital called the Burnett Sanitarium.

Today, this academic-affiliated medical center is located on a 58-acre campus in downtown Fresno offering advanced specialty services not found elsewhere in the region. With a full-service, 56,000-square-foot emergency department – one of the largest in California – it's home to the Table Mountain Rancheria Trauma Center and Leon S. Peters Burn Center, the region's only comprehensive burn and Level I trauma centers. On average, Community Regional receives more than 677 requests a month for patients from other Valley hospitals to be transferred to our hospital for a higher level of care.

The Community Regional campus expanded in 2018 with the completion of the 5-story North Medical Plaza, which today houses outpatient dialysis and Community Outpatient Rehabilitation Center (CORC). The campus also features the Deran Koligian Ambulatory Care Center, partnered with Family Health Care Network, to provide primary and specialty care services.

Across from Community Regional is Terry's House, a 17,000-square-foot, 2-story home that provides a supportive residence for families while their loved one receives critical care in the hospital. This "home away from home" for patients' families, entirely supported by generous donors, has provided comfort and support to more than 10,000 families from 34 countries and all 50 states.

Investments in the downtown campus are underway with plans for investing \$350 million in seismic retrofit upgrades to meet the 2030 seismic mandate. And, Community is working to ensure top-tier neurological services are available today and well into the future with the future Bob Smittcamp Family Neurosciences Institute — opening in summer 2026.

Staffing

Community Regional Medical Center employs nearly 5,700 full time, part time and per diem employees as of February 24, 2026.

More than 300 doctors from one of the nation’s best medical schools receive specialized training each year at Community Regional through the UCSF Fresno Medical Education Program. Residency programs are offers in emergency medicine, family and community medicine, internal medicine, obstetrics/ gynecology, head and neck surgery, orthopedic surgery, pediatrics, psychiatry and surgery. Fellowships also are offered in acute-care surgery, cardiovascular disease, community pediatrics, emergency medicine education, emergency ultrasound, gastroenterology, head and neck oncology, hematology/oncology, HIV, hospice and palliative medicine, infectious disease, interventional cardiology, maternal child health, microvascular reconstruction, pulmonary and critical care, surgical critical care/trauma, sleep medicine and wilderness medicine.
