Central California's Leading Healthcare System

Community Health System (Community) started when local physicians joined forces with Celia Burnett, a boarding house proprietor, to open a private hospital in 1897 — and we've been evolving ever since. Community is a locally owned, not-for-profit, public-benefit organization based in Fresno, California. We are the region's largest employer and healthcare provider caring for the most patients in our region. We operate a residency program with one of the nation's top medical schools, the University of California, San Francisco.

'To better the lives of all those we serve' isn't just our mission, it's our calling. Today, we're serving a larger, more diverse population of patients whose needs are different than those of past generations. To meet the growing healthcare needs of the Central San Joaquin Valley, Community has grown to include hospitals, physicians and health insurance.

Community Medical Centers

We operate four inpatient hospitals — Community Regional Medical Center, Clovis Community Medical Center, Fresno Heart & Surgical Hospital and Community Behavioral Health Center — as well as the Community Cancer Institute, several outpatient centers, subacute and skilled nursing centers and a 20-room hospitality home named Terry's House. With more than 1,400 inpatient beds, Community Medical Centers provides about 60% of Fresno County's inpatient hospital care and advanced expertise typically found only in larger cities. We also serve as the Valley's "safety net" provider, caring for a large share of the uninsured and underinsured in Central California.

Community Provider Network

Our growing Community Provider Network allows for different types of affiliations to accommodate all Valley physicians who wish to align with Community. Community Provider Network is a fast-growing network of primary care and specialty providers who partner with us to improve access to healthcare directly and invest in bringing new physicians, education and research resources to the Valley.

Community Care Health

Our health plan, Community Care Health, is one of the Valley's largest commercial HMO plans, providing nearly 17,000 members access to a broad network of over 2,500 affiliated providers, hundreds of practices and 20 urgent care locations.

Celebrating Milestones

In fall 2025 we opened the Burnett Extended Care Center, a newly redesigned and renovated 62,500-square-foot skilled nursing facility, bringing much-needed access to rehab-focused long-and-short-term skilled nursing care in downtown Fresno.

The Bob Smittcamp Family Neuroscience Institute on the Community Regional Medical Center campus is scheduled to open in June 2026, ensuring top-tier neurological services are available today and well into the future.
