Background

Community Regional Medical Center is the flagship of Community Medical Centers' four inpatient hospitals, with an average daily census of 640 patients. The four facilities under Community Regional's license see a combined total of 820 inpatients a day.

It began in 1897 with Celia Burnett, proprietor of a successful boarding house at the southeast corner of Fulton and Calaveras streets in Fresno, CA. She joined forces with physicians to form a private hospital called the Burnett Sanitarium.

Today, this academic-affiliated medical center is located on a 58-acre campus in downtown Fresno offering advanced specialty services not found elsewhere in the region. With a full-service, 56,000-square-foot emergency department – one of the largest in California – it's home to the Table Mountain Rancheria Trauma Center and Leon S. Peters Burn Center, the region's only comprehensive burn and Level I trauma centers. On average, Community Regional receives more than 760 requests a month for patients from other Valley hospitals to be transferred to our hospital for a higher level of care.

The Community Regional campus expanded in 2018 with the completion of the 5-story North Medical Plaza, which today houses outpatient dialysis, Community Outpatient Rehabilitation Center (CORC) and the Pediatric Specialty Center. The campus also features the Deran Koligian Ambulatory Care Center, partnered with Family Health Care Network, to provide primary and specialty care services. Across from Community Regional is Terry's House, a 17,000-square-foot, 2-story home that provides a supportive residence for families while their loved ones receive critical care in the hospital.

Investments in the downtown campus are underway with plans for investing \$350 million in seismic retrofit upgrades to meet the 2030 seismic mandate. A 154-bed skilled nursing facility on the Community Regional campus, the Burnett Extended Care Center, will open in summer 2025. And, Community is working to ensure top-tier neurological services are available today and well into the future with the future Bob Smittcamp Family Neurosciences Institute — opening in summer 2026.

Residency programs are offered in emergency medicine, family and community medicine, internal medicine, obstetrics / gynecology, head and neck surgery, orthopedic surgery, pediatrics, psychiatry and surgery. Fellowships also are offered in acute-care surgery, cardiovascular disease, community pediatrics, emergency medicine education, emergency ultrasound, gastroenterology, head and neck oncology, hematology/oncology, HIV, hospice and palliative medicine, infectious disease, interventional cardiology, maternalchild health, microvascular reconstruction, pulmonary and critical care, surgical critical care/trauma, sleep medicine and wilderness medicine.
